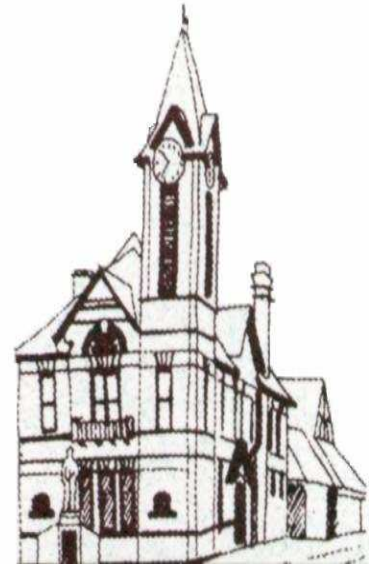

Canadian Reference Centre

The Canadian Reference Centre combines Canadian magazines, newspapers, newswires and reference books to create the largest collection of regional full text content available to Canadian libraries. This database includes leading Canadian periodicals and international (U.S. and U.K.) periodicals in full text; full text reference books; 84,774 full text biographies and an Image Collection of 293,480 photos, maps and flags. Canadian Reference Centre provides full text for leading Canadian magazines including: Alberta Sweetgrass, Bank of Canada Review, Beaver, Benefits Canada, Canadian Business, Canadian Economic Observer, Canadian Geographic, Canadian Manager, Canadian Social Trends, Chatelaine, Computing Canada, Flare, Food in Canada, Harrowsmith Country Life, Maclean's, Manitoba History, Marketing Magazine, Ontario Out of Doors, Profit, Time Canada and many more. Canadian Reference Centre also provides full text for leading Canadian newspapers & newswires including: The Cambridge Reporter, Canadian Press, The Guelph Mercury, The Hamilton Spectator, La Presse Canadienne (en Francais), The Record, The Toronto Star, etc. In addition, this database provides full text for leading Canadian reference books including: Canadian Global Almanac, Gage Canadian Dictionary, Gage Canadian Thesaurus, and many more.

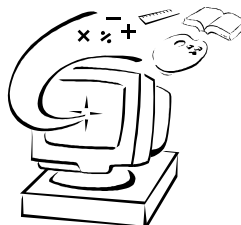

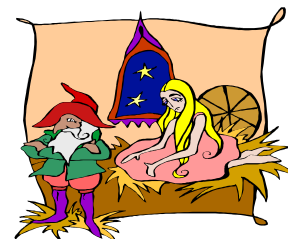
“As We See It”

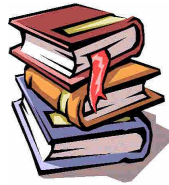
Tax receipts and gift cards are available. Come soon to choose your magazine for the 2009 season. Some are already adopted.

Renew & Reserve Online

You can search the catalogue, renew borrowed items once, and reserve titles online. All you need is a password. Visit or phone the Library to obtain your own password.

Sign onto the library website at

www.uxlib.com.

1. Click the Online Catalogue tab.
2. Click on the Sign-In button at the top right.
3. Enter your library card number as your username and your password.

Renew

1. Click the My Account tab at the top.
2. Click the Current Transactions tab just below. (This will bring up a list of titles you have signed out.)
3. Click renew beside the title to renew your loan of the titles.
NOTE: The title must be renewed before the closing of the Library that day to avoid an overdue fine.

Reserve

1. Search the catalogue and find the title you are looking for.
2. If the box next to the title is red then the title is currently out. If you reserve the title, you will be called when it is available.
3. If the box next to the title is green, the title will be available for you later that day at the circulation desk.
4. For both scenarios, click on the title for more details.
5. Click the Reserve tab in the top right corner.
6. You have now reserved your title.
