
## P.A. DAY PROGRAM @ THE LIBRARY

Cost: \$15.00 per child



1. Click the My Account tab at the top.
2. Click the Current Transactions tab just below. (This will bring up a list of titles you have signed out.)
3. Click renew beside the title to renew your loan of the title. NOTE: The title must be renewed before the closing of the Library that day to avoid an overdue fine.
