




Friends of the Uxbridge Library host a Good Used Book Sale

Guest Andrew Carswell will launch his book, 'Over the Wire', the account of his life for three years in Stalag V111B, a prisoner of war camp.

Andrew left Toronto shortly after his eighteenth birthday, and once enlisted soon qualified as a Lancaster Bomber. On his fourth operational mission the crew was forced to bail out of their burning plane, landing deep in bitterly cold forest, unharmed but unarmed, and ultimately captured.

Ted Barris will interview Andrew on the experiences of this period of his life, including two daring escape attempts and his determination to never give up hope for all that time behind enemy lines! This is Andrew's story, but also the story of tens of thousands of Canadians of his generation, who were proud to serve their country in it's hour of greatest need.

E-BOOKS @ THE LIBRARY

To access and download
E-Books and Audio books,
follow these steps:

1. Go to our website, uxlib.com
2. Click on “e-Books and Audio Books” (at the right)
3. Click on Login (at the top) and follow the instructions to login. Use the number on your library card and the password you set up at the library.
4. At the left, click on whatever genre of e-Book or Audio book you want to download.
5. If the book you want is available, the words “add to cart” will appear. Click this and then “proceed to checkout” to download your digital book.
