

Lunch at the Legion The Great Escape: A Canadian Story with Ted Barris

Wed. Oct. 9, 12:00-2:30 p.m.

Everyone is welcome to join us, especially war veterans and their families, for our 5th annual luncheon at the Uxbridge Legion, featuring Uxbridge resident Ted Barris, well respected author, journalist and broadcaster.

"The Great Escape: A Canadian Story", Ted's 17th book, is a thoroughly researched account derived from numerous interviews, diaries, letters, documents, and never before seen photographs.

On the night of March 24, 1944, 80 Commonwealth airmen crawled through a 336-foot-long tunnel and slipped into the darkness of a pine forest beyond the wire of Stalag Luft III, a German prisoner-of-war compound near Sagan, Poland. The event became known as The Great Escape. The intricate breakout, more than a year in the making, involved as many as 2,000 POWs, extraordinary co-ordination and a battle of wits inconceivable for the time.

Ted is a superb speaker and will no doubt have the audience enthralled with his discussion of this most recent publication!

A limited number of tickets for the event will be on sale at the library.
