

'Home Child' Advocate & Author Visit:

Sandra Joyce , Author and Advocate for the British Home Children, and Director-at-Large for the British Home Child Group will speak at the Uxbridge Historical Centre Schoolhouse (7239 Concession Rd. 6)

on **Thursday, June 11 at 7 p.m.**

Based on her 'Home Child' father's life, Joyce's book 'The Street Arab' looks at the causes of familial breakdown, life in the Homes in the UK, a Home Child's subsequent immigration to Canada, as well as a Home Boy's life on the farm. 'Belonging', the sequel to the 'The Street Arab', looks at the lasting effects this immigration scheme had on these children and their families.

Books are given out a month ahead of the meeting @ Zephyr Library and monthly meetings are held with the exception of July and August.


